How to Get Ready

The PALS Provider Course is designed to teach you the lifesaving skills required to be both a team member and a team leader in either an in-hospital or out-of-hospital setting. Because the PALS Provider Course covers extensive material in a short time, you need to prepare for the course beforehand.

Precourse Requirements (Mandatory)

You will need to prepare for the course by doing the following:

1. Complete the precourse checklist and bring the check list with you to the course.
2. Review the course agenda.
3. Review and understand the information in your PALS Provider Manual. Pay particular attention to the core cases.
4. Review and understand the information on the PALS student CD for BLS skills. The resuscitation scenarios require that your BLS skills and knowledge are current. You will be tested on pediatric 1 rescuer CPR and AED skills at the beginning of the ACLS Provider Course. You will not be taught how to do CPR or how to use an AED. You must know this in advance.
5. Review, understand, and complete the ECG and Pharmacology precourse assessment tests on the PALS student CD. You will not be taught how to read or interpret ECGs in the course, nor will you be taught details about ACLS pharmacology. At the end of the assessment **print your scores and bring them to class. You must have a score of 80% to participate in the class.**

What this Course Does Not Cover

The PALS PROVIDER COURSE does not teach algorithms, ECG, or pharmacology information. If you have not learned or do not understand the ECG and pharmacology information in the precourse assessment test, it is unlikely that you can successfully complete the PALS Provider Course. Please remember there are no refunds for not successfully completing this PALS course. Please contact Preston Bowlin to register for a basic arrhythmia course.

What to Bring and What to Wear

Bring your PALS Provider Manual; Student packet and your Handbook of Emergency Cardiovascular care for Healthcare Providers. Please wear loose, comfortable clothing to class. You will be practicing skills that require you to work on your hands and knees, and the course requires bending, standing, and lifting. If you have any physical condition that might prevent you from engaging in these activities, please tell an instructor. The instructor may be able to adjust the equipment if you have back, knee, or hip problems.

It cannot be emphasized enough that for maximum benefit and the greatest success in this course; participants should be well prepared for class.
